## LOC.R. 75.6 WILLS IN SAFE DEPOSIT BOX

When a decedent has a safe deposit box, for which there is no authorized living signatory, and if there has not been a personal representative appointed for the decedent, then the Court, upon application, may appoint a suitable person as a commissioner for the sole purpose of entering the safe deposit box, to remove and deliver the decedent's will(s) and codicil(s) to the Court. Unless the commissioner waives compensation in writing at the time of the application, in addition to the Court's filing fees, a fee established by the Court shall be payable to the commissioner upon filing of the report and shall be collected as costs upon filing of the application. A case number shall be assigned to the application. The Application to Enter Safe Deposit Box form (Loc. F. 75.7A) and the Report of Entry of Safe Deposit Box form (75.7B) may be used for these purposes.
